

Announcement of the Graduate School, Chiang Mai University

Subject: Procedures for Regaining Graduate School Student Status

According to Article 29.2 of the Chiang Mai University Regulations on Graduate Study, 2007, a student who has forfeited his/her student status, in accordance with articles 27(2), 27(3), 27(5) and 27(11) and Article 29.2 of the Chiang Mai University Regulations on Graduate Study, 2011, or who has forfeited his/her student status in accordance with articles 27(2), 27(3), 27(5) and 27(12), may request restoration of his/her student status by following the conditions set out by the Graduate School.

To regain student status shall be under the conditions and approval of the committee of the Graduate School, as established during the meeting 24/2012, held on 9th November, 2012, at which it was agreed to set the regulations on graduate study as follows:

1. The announcement of the Graduate School, Chiang Mai University No. 0005/2008, Subject-conditions and Procedures for Regaining Student Status, signed on 28th April, 2008 is nullified and these procedures be used instead.
2. A student who has forfeited his/her student status, according to article 29.2 of the Chiang Mai University Regulations on Graduate Study, 2007 and 2011, may request restoration of his/her student status by submitting a request and supporting statement, along with other documents deemed helpful, to the Graduate School at least 60 days prior to the beginning of the semester in which he/she wishes to resume studying.

Regaining Student Status must take place within 365 days of forfeiture of student status.

3. The request, with the consent of the Faculty and the Graduate School, will be submitted to the University for permission.
4. A student who receives permission to regain status must pay a student status restoration fee and, having regained student status, must subsequently follow relevant specifications.
